

## Urgent Motion Request 1452/16 - Waugh v. Bowen – Endorsement of Justice Henderson

“The applicant brings this urgent motion pursuant to the Notice to the Public and the Profession issued by the Chief Justice on March 15, 2020 during the suspension of Court operations due to COVID-19. Based on the applicant’s submissions I find the motion to be presumptively urgent.

I order as follows:

1. The motion shall be heard by teleconference at a hearing to be scheduled by the trial coordinator on Wednesday, April 22, 2020 who shall provide call in details in due course.
2. Irrespective of the service requirements in r. 31 of the *Family Law Rules* taking into account the government requirements regarding social distancing, the applicant shall serve the respondent by email or social media with a copy of his contempt motion, supporting affidavit and a copy of this endorsement and file the material with proof of service by email to the trial coordinator by noon Friday, April 17, 2020.
3. The respondent shall serve the applicant her response by email and file same with proof of service with the trial coordinator by email by no later than Monday, April 20, 2020 4:30 pm.
4. The applicant shall serve and file a short reply affidavit if required in the same manner by no later than noon Tuesday, April 21, 2020.
5. Subject to the discretion of the hearing judge, no affidavit shall exceed 10 pages in length not including exhibits. Exhibits shall include only those relevant to the urgent motion and in this case shall include a copy of the subject order. There shall be no third party affidavits.
6. Affidavits may be served and filed unsworn.”
